Information for Licence Applicants and Licence Holders

The completed Driver Licence Medical must be presented to Access Canberra prior to the due date in order to obtain an original licence or avoid suspension of your current licence (please allow sufficient time for any medical examinations / assessments).

You are required under section 78 of the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000 to undergo a medical examination in accordance with the medical standards set out in 'Assessing Fitness to Drive'.

This Driver Licence Medical is valid for six months from the date of issue. Access Canberra does not acknowledge the return of medical assessment reports. If there is a problem with the report or the report is not received by the due date, you will be contacted.

Should you wish to apply for an internal review of Access Canberra's decision to request a medical, applications for review should be addressed to: The Director, Transport Licensing, PO Box 582 Dickson, ACT 2602. An application for internal review must be made within 28 days of receiving this letter.

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you have the right to apply to the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal (ACAT) to review the decision of the internal review.

An application to the ACAT can only be made following an internal review. Applications to the ACAT must be made within 28 days of the date of the decision of the internal review.
