PURPOSE OF THIS FORM

This form is to be used by a licensee to apply for the transfer of a liquor licence to a new proposed licensee under Section 40 of the *Liquor Act 2010* (the Act). You can access the legislation and its regulation at www.act.gov.au. You may also obtain further information and forms at www.act.gov.au.

PRIVACY

The *Liquor Act 2010* authorises the Commissioner for Fair Trading (the Commissioner) to collect the personal information required by this form for the purposes of assessing the applicant's suitability to hold a liquor licence under the Act. The Commissioner prevents any unreasonable intrusion into a person's privacy in accordance with the *Information Privacy Act 2014*. The Privacy Policy can be found on the Access Canberra website at http://www.act.gov.au/privacy. The Commissioner provides identifiable information to law enforcement organisations and authorised organisations that have legal authority to request information under prescribed circumstances.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION

- A liquor licence can only be transferred whilst it remains in force. The application form must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the current licensee ceasing to trade.
- Read the Further Information provided below prior to completing the application form.
- You must complete <u>all relevant sections</u> of the form before it will be processed.
- The application will not be processed until payment of the application fee has been received.

FURTHER INFORMATION ABOUT APPLYING FOR A LIQUOR LICENCE

An application must outline the suitability of the proposed new licensee/s, close associates, influential persons (if the new licensee is to be a corporation), and the person/s with day-to-day control (if not the licensee).

The *proposed new licensee* is the person/s or corporation that will hold the licence for the premises following the transfer of the licence. If the new licensee is to be a club, they must be an *eligible club*. This is a club that:

- is established for the purposes of recreation, promoting social, religious, political, literary, scientific, artistic, sporting or athletic purposes, or a purpose prescribed by regulation;
- has a constitution or set of rules that requires the election of members to manage the affairs of the club; keeps records of elections
 for two or more years; nominates at least once every three years members to manage the affairs of the club; prohibits the sale of
 liquor to persons who are not members unless there at the invitation of a member; and prohibits the payment of a commission,
 profit or allowance from, or on receipts from, the supply of liquor at the club premises; and
- has a membership of at least 200 adult financial members; or if a club licence has been held continuously since before 1 July 1979, with at least 150 financial adult members.

A *close associate* is a person who: holds, or will hold, an executive position in the new licensee's business; is able to exercise significant influence over the conduct of the new licensee's business because they hold, or will hold, a financial interest in the business; or is entitled to exercise a relevant power in the business.

An *influential person* for a corporation is: an executive officer; a person who may exercise a power in relation to the corporation's management, decision making, elections or appointments, and conduct; a related corporation; or an executive officer in a related corporation. A person with *day-to-day control* is a person, beside the new licensee, who has control of the business operated under the licence on a day-to-day basis.

The licence may not be transferred if the Commissioner for Fair Trading (the Commissioner) determines that any of the people listed above are not suitable. This may include, but is not restricted to, any of the following occurring in the last five (5) years before the day the application is made:

- a person has been found guilty of an offence that makes them unsuitable to hold a liquor licence; or
- a person's liquor licence has been cancelled or suspended on grounds that makes them unsuitable to hold a liquor licence; or
- a person is subject to a court order prohibiting their involvement in the sale of liquor.

If you consider that the proposed new licensee might not be eligible to hold a liquor licence, for example because of an occupational discipline order, past public representations, or past convictions, you should contact Access Canberra before you submit your application form.

Amendments to the licence

This form cannot be used to change particular details of the licence. If you wish to change aspects such as trading hours, on licence subclass or occupancy loading you may submit an amendment form at the time of submitting this application.

LIQUOR PURCHASE/SALES INFORMATION FOR PREMISES (OFF LICENCES ONLY)

A licensee of an **off licence** is required to provide the Commissioner for Fair Trading with the gross wholesale price paid for liquor **purchased** during the financial year, within one month of the end of each financial year. The gross purchase price includes duties or taxes, but not freight or packaging costs. The value of purchases, the name and address of each wholesaler from whom liquor was purchased must be provided. The volume of liquor purchased does not have to be provided.

A **first year micro-producer off licensee** must, at the end of the reporting period for the licence, tell the commissioner in writing the gross price paid or payable for **sales**, during the reporting period, of liquor produced on its licensed premises.

The outgoing licensee is required to report all purchases (off licensee) or sales (off - micro-producer) of liquor accrued up to the point of transfer of the liquor licence.
