

Visual Acuity Assessment

ACT Licence holders who are aged 50, 60, 65 and 70 are required to provide a Visual Acuity Assessment, indicating they meet the visual acuity requirements to hold a driver licence for their licence class type. A Visual Acuity Assessment can be completed by a medical practitioner (GP), optometrist, ophthalmologist or by attending an Access Canberra Service Centre. For Service Centre locations and opening hours visit act.gov.au/accessCBR. Please note that Visual Acuity Assessments are valid for 6 months from the date of assessment. If the Visual Acuity Assessment is submitted incomplete it cannot be accepted by Access Canberra. This may result in a driver licence suspension
